



Leadership and Board Changes at Brant Community Healthcare System

Brantford, ON (September 12, 2017) –

Bonnie Adamson, provincially-appointed Supervisor for the Brant Community Healthcare System, has announced changes at the BCHS.

Effective Wednesday, September 6, the Board of Directors was dissolved. As Supervisor, Ms. Adamson has the authority to exercise all of the powers of the hospital board, the corporation, its officers and employees. A new board will be appointed in 2018.

On September 7, 2017, Ms. Adamson announced that Mr. Jim Hornell, President & CEO of the BCHS left the organization. Ms. Adamson thanked Hornell for his years of dedication, commitment and leadership to the healthcare system and the community.

On September 7, 2017, Dr. Glenn Bartlett was appointed interim Chief Executive Officer at the Brant Community Healthcare System effective immediately.

Dr. Bartlett recently retired as Executive Director of the Windsor Essex Community Health Centre. A graduate of the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine, he received his surgical training in Toronto and Houston, Texas. A general surgeon with special interest in head and neck oncology, and a passion for patient and family-centred care, he has held senior health leadership roles in Ontario and Saskatchewan, including executive roles in hospital- and community-based care, as well as academic health sciences centre settings. Dr. Bartlett has served as Chief of Staff and Vice-President of Medical Affairs at Toronto East General; Vice-President, Medical & Chief Operating Officer, Victoria Hospital, London, Ontario; Vice-President, Medical at Saskatoon Health District; President and CEO, Regina Health District; Executive Director, Exeter Hospital and Executive Director of the Grand Bend Community Health Centre.

Dr. Bartlett's first day onsite at the organization will be Monday, September 18, 2017.
